Chris Gardner and Josh Staten updated the Commission on New Albany's efforts to convert the CSX rail line running from New Albany to Mitchel, Indiana into a trail. New Albany is applying for the grant through DNR for this project and they have hired a consultant to help coordinate the efforts between the State and the other participating communities with the overall goal to connect this trail to the Ohio River Greenway in New Albany.

Chris Gardner also informed the Commission that Mayor Gahan and Mayor Fisher have been discussing the possibilities of approaching Norfolk Southern about opening the K&I bridge to pedestrian traffic. As part of this, New Albany will be moving forward with the approach design from the Greenway to the K&I bridge.

Brian Kallyzny stated that Clarksville will be paving next summer on their rails to trail project with CSX.
