To Whom It May Concern:

The Ohio River Greenway Development Commission (Commission) expresses our support for the above-referenced grant application, which is being prepared by the City of New Albany in conjunction with partners from Floyd, Clark, Washington, Orange and Lawrence Counties. This application involves the conversion of an approximate 69-mile abandoned rail line between New Albany and Bedford into a regional trail.

The Ohio River Greenway Development Commission (Commission) expresses our support and appreciation for the inclusion of Senator Young's Eastern Legacy Extension Act in S.47, the Natural Resource Management Act.

The Commission, together with its member communities and valued partners in state and Federal government have been working for over 20 years on the enhancement of our riverfronts, through the implementation of the Ohio River Greenway Project. Near the center point of this Project is the historic departure point for the Corps of Discovery, a distinction which our communities take great pride in promoting.
